


DATA TO ACTION: ONEIDA COUNTY OFR

- Oneida County, NY
 - ~230,000 population
 - Urban and rural mix
 - Refugees and immigrant community
- OFR established in 2022
 - Lead Agency: Health Department
 - Subgroup of the County's Opioid Task Force – Overdose Response Team
- No current state or local OFR legislation
- Approximately 89 drug-related deaths per year
 - First Case Review – November 2022; target 6-10 reviews in year 1

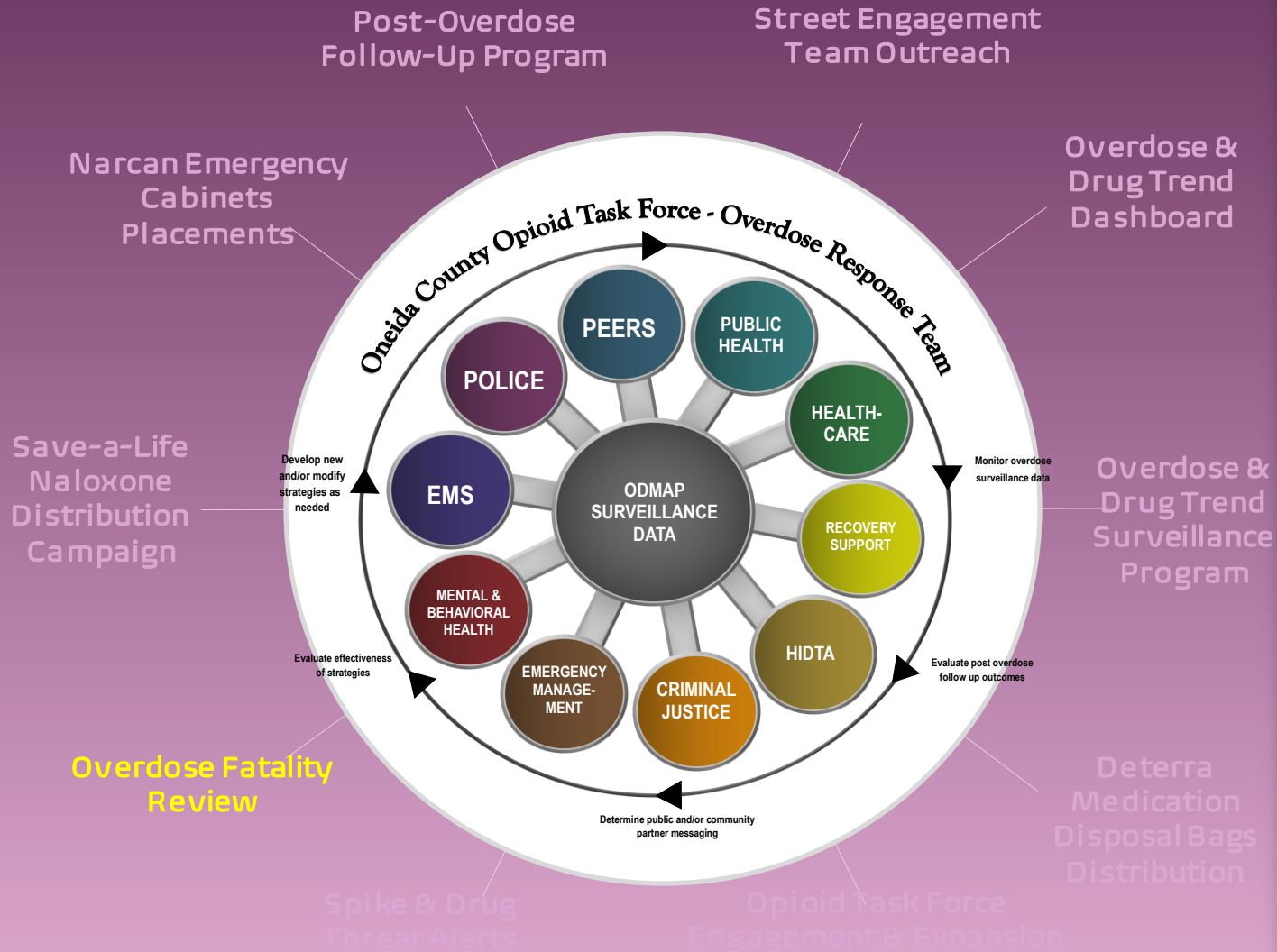

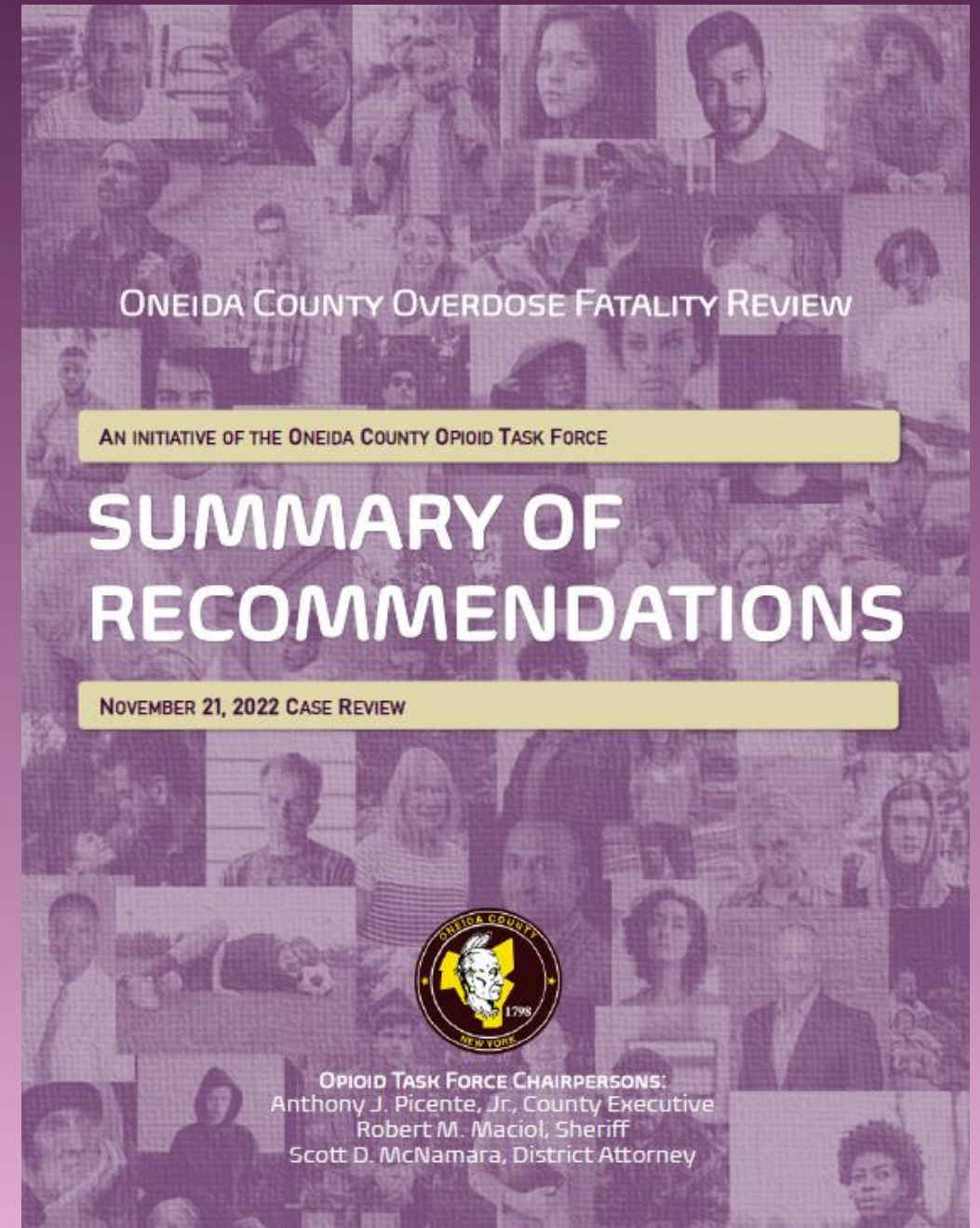
Partnership Relationships

DATA LEADS & GAPS

- Next-of-Kin Interviews (Police Reports, Death Certificate)
- Decedent Biographical Information
- Medical Records (Public Health Access)
 - Identified SUD Provider
 - Identified MH Provider

CASE REVIEW RECOMMENDATIONS

- Peer Recovery Advocate Referrals – NY MATTERS
 - Many system interactions, no connections to peer support
- Harm Reduction and Educational Campaign for Recognizing Signs of Overdose
- Law Enforcement Referrals
- Grief Support for Families Impacted by Overdose Death
